New Dive Flag Law for Arkansas

Previous to the May meeting of the Game and Fish Commission, a diver was only required to fly a dive flag when spearfishing. The law stated that he was to stay within a 300 foot radius of the flag, however, boats were allowed to come within 100 feet of it.

Effective August 1, all persons participating in the practice of scuba diving will be required to fly the divers down flag on all Corps of Engineers controlled waters in Arkansas, regardless of whether or not he is spearfishing. The diver will still be allowed the 300 foot radius and boats must not approach closer than 150 feet. In the near future, boats will be restricted to 300 feet. The new regulation is the result of the Commission voting to enforce the Federal safe boating standards on all federal waters. The A.S.D.A. took an active part in urging the Commissioners to adopt the federal regulations. Please obey all the new rulings. They are set down for your well being.

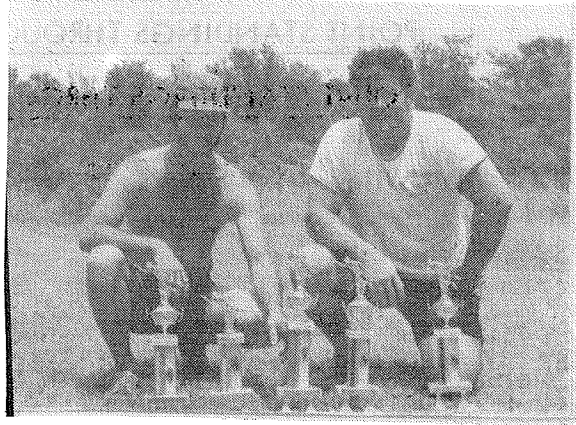

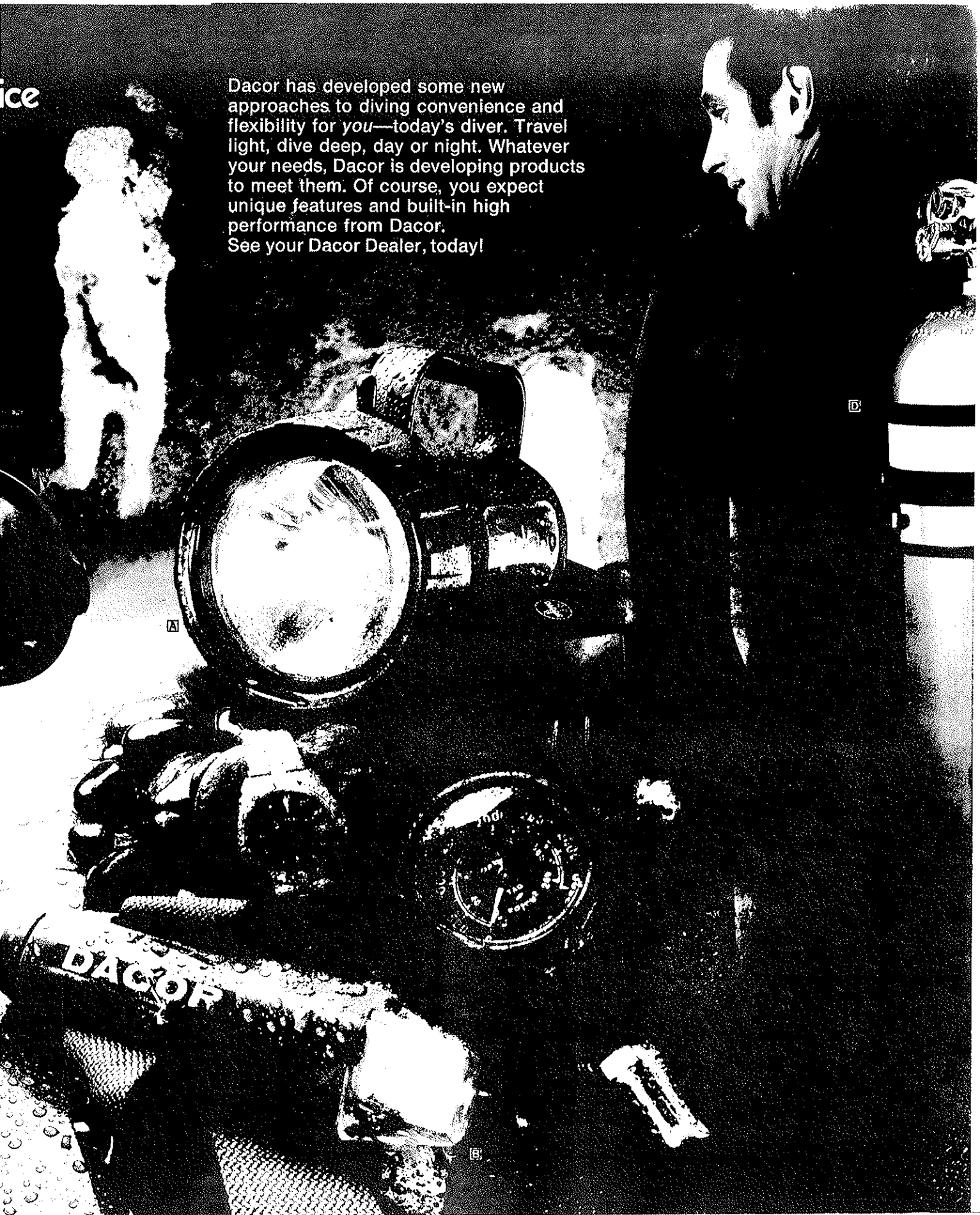

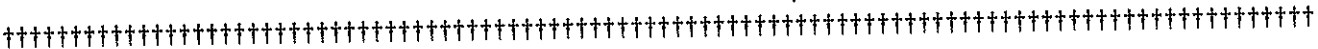


SECRETARY'S REPORT

A NEW DECOMPRESSION METER

The Virginia Mason Research Center (Seattle, Wash.) has developed a new decompression meter. The wrist decompression meter, called the "Borom-Johnson Decompression Meter," is wrist worn.

Dr. Brian G. D'Aoust, of Virginia Mason Research Center, says the decompression meter is a physical analog of the U.S. Navy diving tables. Dr. D'Aoust feels the present problem with decompression is the decompression tables, which he points out depend on two basic types of assumptions—on the rates of gas saturation and desaturation, and on the rate-of-ascent criteria. He is confident that the Borom-Johnson decompression meter will solve these problems. It is not known who will market the new meter.
